Fire Commissioners Meeting Minutes May 4, 2016

Chairman Plews called the meeting to order at 7:03 a.m. Present: Commissioners Bennett, Plews & Hirsch. Lisa Brengan was present as minute-taker.

<u>MINUTES:</u> Commissioner Hirschi MOTIONED: to approve the minutes of the April 20, 2016 regular meeting as presented. **SECOND**: Commissioner Bennett. Unanimous vote. **Motion passes.**

FINANCIAL REPORT: Expense accounts payables in the amount of \$4,921.16 vouchers 604000026 - 604000036, dated 4/8/16; \$63,437.43 vouchers 604000037 - 604000087, dated 4/25/16 were reviewed.

<u>ASSOCIATION REPORT:</u> Potter & Burbridge gave report – Colleen ran the meeting and did a great job, there was no action taken. Chief Burbridge gave a "Lock out/Tag out" presentation.

CHIEF'S REPORT:

- Wildland preparation in progress past two weeks. Dodge pickup 50% prepped, with maintenance expected to be complete soon. Refresher complete, with a high number of red card certifications this year (county-wide.)
- Opportunity with the construction company paving US 101. Their water needs for the project, and the stations need for driveway repair. Cost options pending.

- Chief Burbridge recommended a revision to Policy #2198 "Ambulance Transport Base Rates"; from \$500 and \$12.00 per mile revised to: \$\$550 and \$13.50 per mile.

HVAC Bid Station 41: Chief Burbridge reported on the HVAC/new roof needs at Station41. After discussion, **BOARD AGREED** to go out for bid on this project.

GOOD OF THE ORDER: As of May 1, 2016, former Squaxin Chief of Police, Chris Peters is now the Executive Director of the Tribe. Alex Ehler will be sworn in as the new Chief of Police on May 12. This new transition offers a great opportunity for the Tribe and Fire District to talk about the possibility of a Public Safety building that could house Police, Fire & DEM in one location.
